What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Aurora Balanced Strategy has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. FundRock NZ Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

Objective: To deliver returns exceeding the CPI by 3.4% per annum before fees and tax, over a suggested investment timeframe of 6+ years.

Strategy: Diversified strategy aiming to provide a balance between stability of returns and growth, by investing in a mix of income and growth assets. The underlying portfolio is actively managed and includes cash, fixed interest, infrastructure, Australasian equities, and international equities. Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) and sustainability considerations are integrated into portfolio decision making. The strategy invests 40% in the Aurora Conservative Fund and 60% in the Aurora Growth Fund.

The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

What fees are investors charged?^{See note 2}

Investors in the Aurora Balanced Strategy are charged fund charges which are:

The strategy invests 40% in the Aurora Conservative Fund and 60% in the Aurora Growth Fund. The fees are based on how much the investment option invests in each of the funds and how much they charged.

Example of how this applies to an investor^{See note 3}

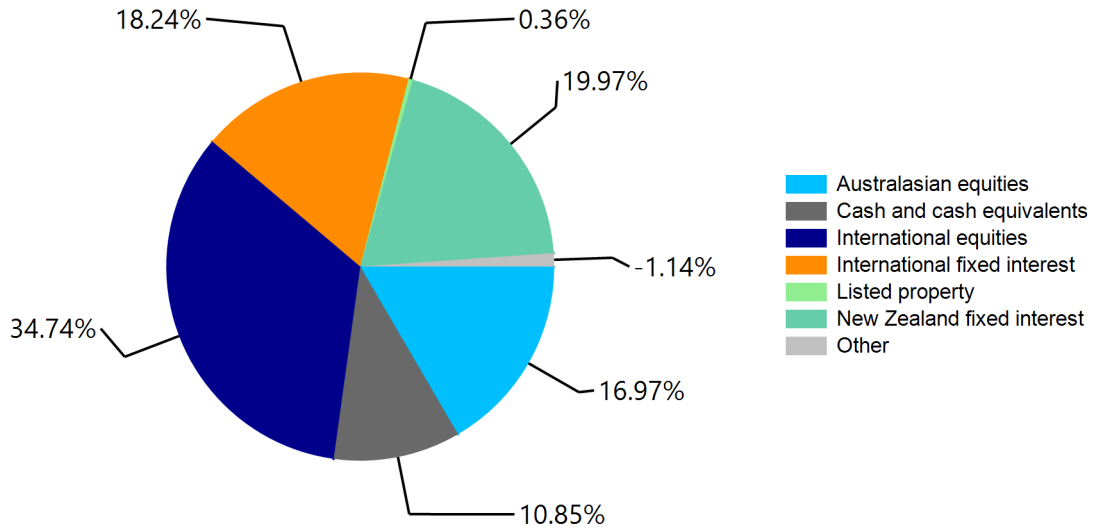
Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Anthony had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Anthony received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$1,088 (that is 10.88% of his initial \$10,000). Anthony also paid \$36 in other charges. This gives Anthony a return after tax of \$949 for the year.

This shows the types of assets that the fund invests in.

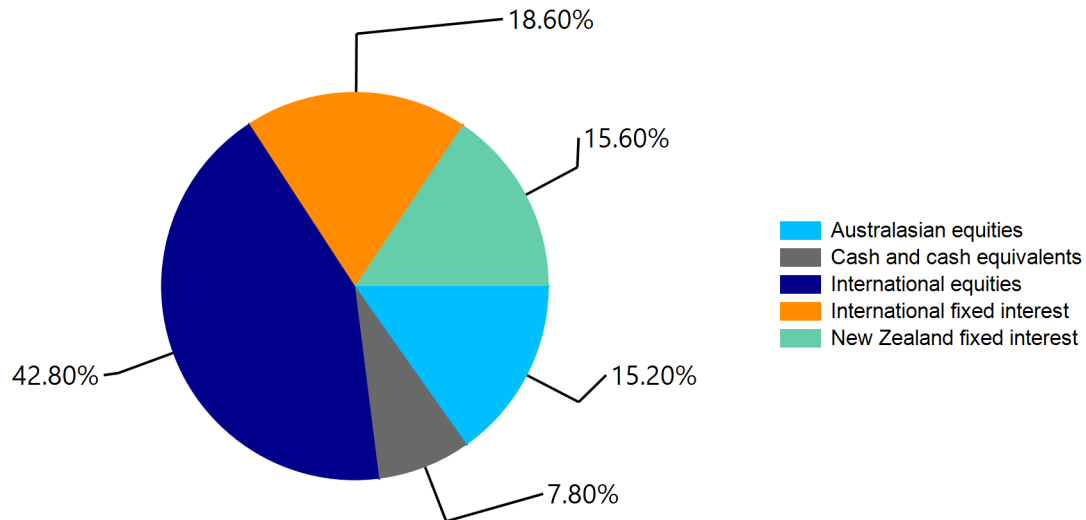
Actual Investment Mix

Notes

1. A combination of actual returns and market index returns have been used to determine the risk indicator as the strategy has not been operating for the required five years. Market index returns have been used until 31 August 2023 and actual returns thereafter. The risk indicator may therefore provide a less reliable indicator of the strategy's future volatility.
2. As the fund has not completed a full scheme year as at 31 March 2024, historical fee information is not available.
3. As the fund has not existed for a full year, figures in this example are based on returns from the date of the first fund contribution (21 August 2023).
